Introduction

The Integrated Planning and Reporting requirements as they currently stand under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1995 do very little for the long term sustainability of local governments. They simply create an additional burden for staff and Councillors and do even less for the community in terms of setting a long term direction and awareness.

The current framework provides a sound basis for the longer term direction of a local government but very little is done to stick to the longer term plans. In fact, many local governments simply pay lip service to both the Community Strategic Plan and the Corporate Business Plan and simply focus on the annual budget which is often not reflective of the longer term focus.

In some cases the aspiration documents also do not closely align to the Long Term Finance Plan which results in large variations between the long term financial forecasts and large variations in terms of rate increases year on year. This not only undermines the long term strategic planning but results in a lack of transparency from a community perspective on projects and funding.

Potential amendments

In order to provide some additional rigour to the IPRF process, it would be appropriate to adopt changes which would ensure longer term planning and funding could be achieved through a consultative and transparent process.

- 1) This would be supported by the inclusion of a long term rating strategy which would need to adopted by absolute majority, and could only be varied following further community consultation.
- 2. Motion to amend by absolute majority
- 3. Community consultation for 28 days outlining the reasons for the changes and the implications for both ratepayers and the services/projects being delivered and must meet/exceed the numbers of community consulted/engaged for the original development of the plan.
- 4. Community must be advised of the changes being proposed and the budget items to be removed or added which have resulted in the changes being required.
- 5. Following consultation all submissions must be addressed and responded to and placed on the Council website
- 6. Council then must publish the reasons and implications of the final changes being adopted.

The rationale for the above matters is to allow for long term planning which is aligned to both rate income and asset management and prevents year on year variations aligned to election cycles. It would also ensure that the longer term financial position of the Council could be more effectively managed and monitored. Finally, it would also give the community a clear indication of where the rate increases are planned for the next few years allowing the community to better plan as well.

Alignment of the review of the rating strategy with the major review of the Community Plan would help to ensure consistency with the community aspirations.
